This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued subject to prior existing rights

on the source. The allowance for water is made for five (5)

acres of land, being the number of acres found to be susceptible

of cultivation & irrigation.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed

--0.05-cubic feet per second, or fifteen acre-feet per annum.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 17, 1915.

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before June 17, 1915.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before May 17, 1916.

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before October 17, 1916.

Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with the State Engineer on or before November 17, 1916.

The undersigned, Emory Arvold, a citizen of the United States, residing in the County of White Pine in the State of Nevada, hereby makes application for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada, as hereinafter stated.

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is the head waters of what is known as South Creek, which is situated about two miles southerly from the old mining town of Ruby Hill, and about one mile north of what is known as South Camp, in White Pine County, State of Nevada, and on the eastern slope of the Schell creek range of mountains. South Creek flows through the first canon south of what is known as Ruby Canon, and has its source in four springs which are situated at or near the junction of two canons, one of which heads near Ruby Mountain to the north west, and the other extends south west and is known as Snowbank Canon.

2. The amount of water applied for and which flows from said springs, is from one quarter to one half of one second foot.

3. The water is to be used for irrigation and domestic purposes.

4. The water is to be diverted from its sources at the following points: First, by a ditch to be constructed from spring designated as "Spring No. 1", situated on the north side of South Creek, about 300 feet from the channel of South Creek, said ditch to be carried about 600 feet in length on a south west course to Snowbank Canon. Second: by a ditch to be constructed from two springs designated as "Spring No. 2" and "Spring No. 3", situated at the mouth of Snowbank Canon, making the head waters of South Creek, and to be carried thence about 800 feet on a south easterly course. Third: by a ditch to be constructed from a spring, designated "Spring No. 4" situated in a patch of willows of two or three acres in extent, which lies about 250 feet easterly from springs Nos. 2 and 3, thence on a south easterly course, passing over a rim rock and around a side hill above what is known as Corral Canon, a distance of about 1500 feet. Fourth: by a ditch on the north side of South Creek Canon, to be constructed from a spring to be designated as "Spring No. 4", to a point about 600 feet northerly from old corral, and being in all about 1200 feet in length.

(a) The number of acres to be irrigated: an area of about from twenty five to thirty acres.

(b) The land is unsurveyed, and therefore, cannot be described by legal subdivisions, but it is included in the land upon which the applicant has filed for a homestead, and is further described as follows: Ditch No. 1 will irrigate from 5. to 7 acres, situated east and south of said ditch. Ditch No. 2 will irrigate from 8 to 10 acres situated east and north of same. Ditch No. 3 will irrigate from 10 to 12 acres lying north and north easterly of same, and Ditch No. 4 will irrigate from 4 to 6 acres lying south of same.

Irrigation will begin about May 15th and end about October 1st of each year.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED WORKS.

The said ditches will be of dimensions sufficient to carry the full amount of water appropriated.

(5) Estimated cost of work, about \$500.00.

(6) Estimated time required to construct works, about 18 months.

(7) Remarks- After the works of diversion have been constructed it will require one year to put the water to beneficial use.

The applicant intends to develop and increase the water supply, immediately upon the approval of his application.
