The undersigned Glasgow & Western Exploration Co., Ltd.
of Battle Mountain, County of Lander,
State of Nevada, hereby make application for
permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada,
as hereinafter stated. (If applicant is a corporation give date and
place of incorporation.) Glasgow, Scotland under Companies Act
of Great Britian in March 1899.

- 1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Copper Canyon Springs.
2. The amount of water applied for is one-half second-feet.
3. The water to be used for mining, milling and domestic purposes.
4. The water is to be diverted from its source at the following point: The NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4, Sec. 21, T. 31 N.R. 43 E., M.D.M. (Unsurveyed)

IF THE WATER IS TO BE USED FOR IRRIGATION, SUPPLY THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

(g) Remarks The above are small springs of variable flow, developed by means of tunnels driven by the Glasgow & Western Exploration Co., Ltd., about thirty years ago, and the total flow has been regularly used by said company for the past sixteen years. The entire flow has been piped from source to point of use by means of a pipe line.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED WORKS

The total flow is handled by means of a 3" pipe to a head box near State manner in which water is to be diverted, whether by dam or other works, whether through pipes, ditches, flumes, or other conduits. If water tunnel entrance from which it is conducted to point of use by means is to be stored in reservoirs it should be so stated and the location of the reservoir should be given with reference to the legal subdivisions. of a pipe capable of handling the maximum flow.

7. Remarks Pipe line in use has been laid for 16 years; size of pipes laid not definitely known.

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

That this permit does not purport to grant any right of way over or across any lands, but merely the right to use the water of Copper Canon Springs. That the watering barrels and tap mentioned in office letter of July 16th, 1914, shall be installed by the applicant and that the use of water from said tap shall be permitted as stipulated and confirmed in said letter of July 16th, 1914.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed One half (1/2) cubic feet per second.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 1st, 1914.

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before November 1st, 1914.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before January 1st, 1915.

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before October 1st, 1915. Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with State Engineer on or before November 1st, 1915.
