This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued subject to all prior rights on the source. The State reserves the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times. It is distinctly understood that the applicant agrees to the terms herein contained.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 0.025 cubic feet per second. (One-fortieth).

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 8, 1918.

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before November 8, 1918.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 8, 1919.

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before November 8, 1919.

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before April 8, 1920. Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with State Engineer on or before May 8, 1920.
