The undersigned, Antelope Valley Land and Cattle Company, of Reno, Washoe County, State of Nevada, a corporation, incorporated in the year 1912, hereby makes application to change the point of diversion of waters heretofore appropriated and beneficially used, as hereinafter shown.

- 1.- The source of the water supply of the proposed change is Walker River.
- 2.- The amount of the water applied for to be changed is 54.88 cubic feet per second.
- 3.- The water is to be used for irrigation, stockwatering, and domestic purposes.
4. The water is to be diverted from its source at the following point: The Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section Two, Township 13 N., R. 25 E., M.D.B. & M.
- 5.- The point of diversion heretofore used for diverting water from the Walker River under the appropriation is as follows: The Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section Two, Township 13 N., R. 25 E., M.D.B. & M. (The water has been diverted through the Spragg, Alcorn, & Buley Ditch.
- 6.- The water herewith applied for to be changed has been beneficially and continuously used upon the following described lands: E. $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 2, part of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 2, T. 13 N., R. 25 E., part or all of Secs. 35, 36, 25, 26, 23, 24, 13, 14, 11, 12, and 1 of T. 14 N., R. 25 E. Parts of Secs. 19, 20, 30, and 31 of T. 15 N., R. 26 E., and Parts of Secs. 24, 25, and 36 of T. 15 N., R. 25 E.; all M.D.B. & M.; being the land named in the proofs filed with the State Engineer under which the Thurtell findings were made, fixing water rights on the Walker River, and the lands named in Application and Permit No. 2309 issued by the State Engineer of Nevada, to which instruments reference is hereby made, and which are made a part hereof, for the purpose of designating more specifically the lands for which water has been appropriated.
- 7.- The number of acres heretofore irrigated is 4715.
8. The number of acres proposed to be irrigated is 4715.
9. The description of the land proposed to be irrigated is as designated in Paragraph 6 above.
10. The estimated cost of the proposed works is one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars.
11. The estimated time required to construct the works is one year.
12. Irrigation will begin about March 1st. of each year, and end about November 1st. of each year; but without specifically limiting the season, the water will be used, as heretofore, whenever conditions permit, at any time throughout the year.
13. The water has been used heretofore during the months of March first to November first, inclusive, each year, and sometimes at earlier and later periods, when conditions permitted.
14. REMARKS: It is intended by this application to change the point of diversion only of waters heretofore appropriated and used, or appropriated and in the process of use, through the Spragg, Alcorn, & Buley ditch above mentioned.

The priority of the right, as well as the extent thereof, are fixed by the Thurtell findings, which now are accepted as the basis of a final decree in the suit of the Pacific Livestock Company, et al., against T. B. Rickey, and others, also the waters appropriated under Application and Permit No. 2309, issued by the State Engineer.

There are other water rights from the Spragg, Alcorn, & Buley Ditch, belonging to parties other than the applicant, which are not involved in this application, and which probably will remain as they are, or be changed as the owners thereof see fit to do.

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit, to change the point of diversion of the Spragg, Buley and Alcorn Ditch, is issued with the understanding that no other rights will be impaired thereby, and with the further understanding that no additional rights are granted herein. A standard headgate and weir must be installed at the new point of diversion to facilitate the measurement and control of water.

The State reserves the right to regulate the use of water under the change authorized by this permit at any time, in accordance with the stipulation, or any modification thereof, in that certain U. S. District Court Decree No. 731, in the case entitled Pacific Livestock Co., vs. T. B. Rickey, et al., and in accordance with the terms of Permit No. 2309. The amount of water which may be diverted at the new point of diversion shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed the amount at present used through the Spragg, Buley and Alcorn Ditch by the applicant, as set forth in that certain U. S. District Court Decree No. 731, in the case entitled Pacific Livestock Co., vs. T. B. Rickey, et al. and as set forth in Permit No. 2309.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 5, 1920.

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before July 5, 1920.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 5, 1921.

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before July 5, 1921.

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before June 5, 1922. Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with the State Engineer on or before July 5, 1922.
