In connection with this application the applicant is also filing herewith an application with the State Engineer for approval of transfer and change of point of diversion and manner and place of use of the water rights of Margaret T. Ryan in Star Canyon Creek, the use of the said water rights of Margaret T. Ryan being for irrigation purposes and having a priority as of the year 1862. The contemplated use to be made by applicant for railroad and domestic purposes is to be continuous throughout the year to the extent of one and one-quarter second feet. Inasmuch as one and one-quarter cubic feet per second exceeds the measured dry weather flow of said creek, some future storage is contemplated when sufficient gaugings have been secured to determine the average dry weather flow and the amount of storage necessary. No figures or specifications are available at the present time.

The purpose of the instant application is to secure a permit and certificate to appropriate one and one-quarter second feet continuous flow throughout the entire period of each year not covered by the prior rights of Margaret T. Ryan vested as of the year 1862.

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This Permit is issued subject to all prior rights. It is understood that the 1-1/4 cubic feet of water per second herein granted is only a temporary allowance and the final water right obtained under this permit will be dependent upon the amount of water actually placed to a beneficial use. It is further understood that accurate measurements of the water placed to beneficial use will be included in the proof of such use when filed. The State reserves the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed one and one-fourth cubic feet per second.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 1, 1931

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before June 1, 1931

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before May 1, 1932

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before June 1, 1932

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before May 1, 1936

Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with State Engineer on or before June 1, 1936
