Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife of Portland, County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, hereby make application for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada, as hereinafter stated. This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued subject to all existing rights on the source. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 0.004 cubic feet per second, for wildlife watering purposes

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 13, 1959

Proof of commencement of work shall be filed before May 13, 1959

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before April 13, 1960

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before May 13, 1960

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before April 13, 1960

Proof of the application of water to beneficial use must be filed with State Engineer on or before May 13, 1960
