The applicant ELKO COUNTY, on behalf of the residents of the Townsite of Jarbidge of ELKO County of NEVADA, hereby make application for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada, as hereinafter stated. (If applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation; if a copartnership or association, give names of members.)

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is BEAR CREEK Name of stream, lake or other source.

2. The amount of water applied for is one (1) second-foot One second-foot equals 448.83 gals. per min.

3. The water to be used for Domestic Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic, or other use.

4. If use is for:

(a) Irrigation (state number of acres to be irrigated)

(d) Power:

(1) Horsepower developed

(2) Point of return of water to stream

5. The water is to be diverted from its source at the following point: approximately 3/4 of a mile West of

intersection of Bear Creek and Main Street of Jarbidge Townsite

6. Place of use Jarbidge Townsite, Nevada

7. Use will begin about January and end about December, of each year.

See application of Elkora Mining Co. former appropriator who has abandoned use of the water and means of diversion, which has been used continuously by residents of Jarbidge.
