11. Remarks The Onetha Mine is the only mine at Hamilton, White Pine Mining District consistently mining for the past 15 years and the only mine now in operation. Water for culinary and mining use has been taken intermittently from this spring for at least the past 8 years. We know of no other beneficial use from this spring other than for livestock during the summer months. The continued use of water is necessary to maintain our camp and mining operations currently employing 7 men.
