waters of the State of Nevada, as hereinafter stated. (If applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation; if a copartnership or association, give names of members.)

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is underground (Pearl Creek Well) Name of stream, lake or other source.

2. The amount of water applied for is 0.5 second-feet One second-foot equals 448.83 gals. per min.

3. The water to be used for Stockwater & Domestic Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic, or other use.

4. If use is for:

(a) Irrigation (state number of acres to be irrigated)

(c) Other use (describe fully under "No. 12. Remarks")

(d) Power:

(1) Horsepower developed

(2) Point of return of water to stream

5. The water is to be diverted from its source at the following point: NW 1/4 Section 23, T.28N.,

R.56E., MDB&M.

6. Place of use Section 23, T.28N., R.56E., MDB&M.
