The applicant Bureau of Land Management, Winnemucca District, 705 E. 4th Street, of Winnemucca, Nevada 89445, hereby make application for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada, as hereinafter stated.

- 1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Depoli Well, an underground source
2. The amount of water applied for is .02 second-feet
3. The water to be used for stockwater, other use
4. If use is for: (a) Irrigation, state number of acres to be irrigated; (b) Stockwater, state number and kinds of animals to be watered: 110 cattle; (c) Other use (describe fully under "No. 12. Remarks"): 17 wild horses; (d) Power:
5. The water is to be diverted from its source at the following point: NE 1/4, NE 1/4 of Sec. 14, T. 21 N., R. 24 E., M.D.B.&M.
6. Place of use NE 1/4, NE 1/4, of Sec. 14, T. 21 N., R. 24 E., M.D.B.&M.
7. Use will begin about January 1 and end about December 31, of each year.
8. Description of proposed works. (Existing) Well, abandoned windmill, pump trough, and pipeline.
9. Estimated cost of works \$3,200.00

10. Estimated time required to construct works. See attachment
If well completed, describe works.

11. Estimated time required to complete the application of water to beneficial use. three years

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued subject to all existing rights on the source. It is understood that the amount of water herein granted is only a temporary allowance and that the final water right obtained under this permit will be dependent upon the period of use and the average number of livestock served from the waters of this source. It is further understood that this right must allow for a reasonable lowering of the static water level at permittee's well due to any other ground water development in the area. The well shall be equipped with a 2-inch opening for measuring depth to water. If well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times but does not take responsibility for the use of the Federal range.

This Permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 0.004 cubic feet per second, OR sufficient water to water 110 head of cattle and 17 horses.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before January 25, 1985

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before February 25, 1985

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before January 25, 1987

Proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before February 25, 1987

DESCRIPTION OF
EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS

NAME: Depoli Well

LOCATION: N.E.¼, N.E.¼, of Section 14 T.21N., R.24E., M.D.B.&M.

The following is a general description of the existing well and improvements found either by the undersigned or by personnel supervised by the undersigned. Where information regarding well depth and/or well casing depth are given, the source is from BLM record data.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION (1981): The well casing is 6" diameter and 200 feet deep. The onsite equipment consists of one abandoned windmill, one Fairbanks Morse pump, and one 24' x 15' radius on either side x 2' deep trough with connecting pipe to well, and one 24' long and rough with 15' radii on each end by 2' deep with connecting pipe to well.
