

ATTACHMENT FOR TEMPORARY APPLICATION TO CHANGE  
APPLICANT: TRUCKEE CARSON LEASING AUTHORITY

ITEM NO. 2

A temporary reduction in releases from Truckee River storage will be necessary to accumulate the volume of water requested. A reduction in releases of 50 cfs will allow 2,104.30 acre feet to accumulate in approximately 25 days. Sufficient retention is requested to accumulate the 2,104.30 acre feet of water in Boca Reservoir, should 50 cfs be restrictive.

ITEM NO. 8

Attached are copies of the "Limited Power of Attorney" documents which provide Truckee Carson Leasing Authority with the power to act in behalf of the water right owners. This document includes a legal description, a Truckee Carson Irrigation District (TCID) serial number and a copy of an aerial photograph highlighting the acreage to be stripped of water. Blue lines of the Property and Structure Maps (P and S Maps) on file at TCID will be submitted which illustrate the location of the existing place of use. Acre footage is derived by the number of acres times 2.99 acre feet per acre.

ITEM NO. 11

Releases from storage are proposed to be temporarily reduced in such a manner that will allow for the storage of 2,104.30 acre feet of water in Boca Reservoir. Diversions of Truckee River water by Derby Dam under Claim No. 3 are proposed to be temporarily reduced by the same rate made for storage retention.

All of the facilities currently exist. Construction of new facilities is not required.

ITEM NO. 15

The amount of water proposed for storage is based on drying up 703.78 acres of land within the Newlands Project receiving water from the Truckee River. Only the consumptive use, estimated to be 2.99 acre feet per acre by the Alpine Decree for the Newlands Project, will be placed into storage. The difference between the consumptive use (2.99 acre feet per acre) and the duty of water (3.5 and 4.5 acre feet per acre) for the existing place of use will not be stored. This difference (0.51 and 1.51 acre feet per acre, respectively) will remain in the Truckee River system for the protection of existing water users.
