hereby make application for permission to change the point of diversion, manner of use, and place of use of all of water heretofore appropriated under permit 52354; well GEN-7

- 1. The source of water is underground; Gravel Road Well
2. The amount of water to be changed 0.5 cfs (224.42 gpm); 215.1 Acre feet/year (70.1 MgA)
3. The water to be used for dust suppression
4. The water heretofore permitted for mining, milling, and domestic
5. The water is to be diverted at the following point Within the NE quarter of the NW quarter of section 30 of T34N, R49E, M.D.B.&M. at a point from which the SW corner of section 31, of T34N, R49E, M.D.B.&M. bears S 11°31' W a distance of 10,050 feet.
6. The existing permitted point of diversion is located within NE quarter of the SE quarter of section 29 of T36N, R50E, M.D.B.&M. at a point from which the SW corner of section 32 of T36N, R50E, M.D.B.&M. bears S 32°17' 04" W a distance of 9,014.71 feet.
7. Proposed place of use that portion of the Dunphy Rd. which lies within the following: lots 4,5,6,7, sec.6, T33N, R49E, M.D.B.&M.; lots 4,5,6,7, sec. 6; lots 1,2,3,4, sec. 7; lots 1,2,3,4, sec. 18; lots 1,2,3,4, sec. 19; lots 1,2,3,4, sec. 30; and lots 1,2,3,4, sec. 31, T34N, R49E, M.D.B.&M.; lots 1,2,3,4, sec.31, T35N, R49E, M.D.B.&M.
8. Existing place of use section 32, T36N, R50E, M.D.B.&M.
9. Use will be from January 01 to December 31 of each year.
10. Use was permitted from January 01 to December 31 of each year.
11. Description of proposed works. (Under the provisions of NRS 535.010 you may be required to submit plans and specifications of your diversion or storage works.) Existing well drilled under permit 46049, equipped with a pump, motor, totalizing flow meter, and a pipeline to a standpipe.
12. Estimated cost of works not applicable - well completed under permit 46049.
13. Estimated time required to construct works steel casing, equipped as described above (11.)

14. Estimated time required to complete the application of water to beneficial use five years

15. Remarks: For use other than irrigation or stock watering, state number and type of units to be served or annual consumptive use:

This application is hereby submitted for a permanent permit to allow use of water for maintenance and dust suppression on the Dunphy Road, a frequently used mine access road. Any temporary permit in force for the same point of diversion and manner of use at the time a permanent permit is issued under this application will be withdrawn upon receipt of said permit.

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit to change the point of diversion, manner of use and place of use of the waters of an underground source as heretofore granted under Permit 52354 is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 52354 and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. The well shall be equipped with a 2-inch opening and a totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins or before the proof of completion of work is filed. If the well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. This source is located within an area designated by the State Engineer pursuant to NRS 534.030. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

This permit is issued subject to the water management plan and water management plan addendum among Barrick Goldstrike Mines, Inc.; Newmont Gold Company; and T S Ranch Joint Venture dated May 1, 1989.

The amount of water to be changed shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 0.5 cubic feet per second, but not to exceed 70.08 million gallons annually.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before March 13, 1995

Proof of completion of work shall be filed before February 13, 1995

Application of water to beneficial use shall be made on or before March 13, 1996

Proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before February 13, 1996

(PERMIT TERMS CONTINUED)

Any water obtained as a result of the dewatering operation of Barrick Goldstrike Mines, Inc. or Newmont Gold Company shall be used first by the permittee for mining, milling, heap leaching, drilling, road watering and other related mining and milling uses hereinafter referred to as mining and milling uses within the described place of use and prior to any use of the water authorized under Permits 49960, 50688, 50939, 51074, 51750, 51963, 52354, 52795 (Certificate 13396), 52797 (Certificate 13397), 52999, 53000, 54335, 54337, 55127, 56607, 56608, 56609, 56610, 56611, 56612, 59058, 59750-T, 59751-T, 59752-T, 59753-T, 59754-T and 59755-T.

The total amount of water under the above mentioned permits shall not exceed 2,000 million gallons annually.

The State Engineer retains the right to regulate the pumping from the dewatering project and/or any other groundwater withdrawals herein authorized to protect the public interest and existing rights.

A monthly report shall be submitted to the State Engineer within 10 days from the end of the month which shall include the amount pumped from each well and the amount used for each mining and milling purpose.

This permit is subject to the "Boulder Valley Monitoring Plan" previously approved by the State Engineer on April 10, 1991.

This permit is issued under the preferred use provisions of NRS Chapter 534. The manner of use of water under this permit is by nature of its activity a temporary use and any application to change the manner of use granted under this permit will be subject to additional determination and evaluation with respect to the permanent effects on existing rights and the resource within the ground water basin.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies and is specifically issued contingent upon approval by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection of the dewatering project.
