APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued subject to State Engineer's Ruling #6277 and all existing rights on the source. It is understood that the 0.19 c.f.s., herein granted is only a temporary allowance and that the final water right obtained under this permit will be dependent upon the amount of water actually placed to a beneficial use. State Engineer's Ruling #6277 sets forth that the applicant shall measure the total evapotranspiration in excess of precipitation using accepted methods and practices on the Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge for at least five consecutive years, and submit that information to the State Engineer to satisfy the requirement for proof of beneficial use. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

State Engineer's Ruling #6277 requires a monitoring program for springs, groundwater levels and lake stages on the Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge to be submitted for approval to the State Engineer within one year from the date this permit is granted. This monitoring program will be deemed to represent the proof of completion.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.





Water will be used to maintain a spring pool for Fish and Wildlife purposes. Water flowing out of the spring pool will enter Ruby Lake and support fish and wildlife habitat in the lake. A measure of the combined flow for springs 173, 174, 175, 176 and 177 can be made at the pool outlet. Individual flow measurements are not possible.

DISCLAIMER: By filing this application to appropriate waters of the state of Nevada, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service does not hereby waive any claim to federal reserved water rights or otherwise diminish or supplant any claims to water made in the adjudication of the waters of Ruby Valley, Elko, and White Pine Counties, State of Nevada (Matter of the Determination of the relative Rights in and to the Waters of Ruby Valley, Elko, and White Pine Counties, Nevada). Notice in this matter was filed on January 17, 1983. Nor should the filing of these applications by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service be deemed a waiver of the right of the United States to have its water rights adjudicated only in proceedings that constitute a "suit" under the McCarran Amendment, 43 U.S.C. § 666.
