The applicant **Truckee Meadows Water Authority**, hereby makes application for permission to change the **Place and Manner of Use** of water heretofore appropriated under **Permit No. 66157**

1. The source of water is **Truckee River**
2. The amount of water to be changed **62.5% of 3.48 cfs, not to exceed 62.5% of 556.8 acre feet annually.**
3. The water to be used for **Wildlife purposes**
4. The water heretofore permitted for **Municipal**
5. The water is to be diverted at the following point **There will be no diversion of water, see attached Exhibit "C". No Change**
6. The existing permitted point of diversion is located within **The points of diversion of Sierra Pacific's existing water treatment plants as described in attached Exhibit "A" and as shown on the map supporting Application No. 58882 on file with the Division of Water Resources, State of Nevada.**
7. Proposed place of use **Within the limits of the natural stream bed and banks of the Truckee River from the existing Points of Diversion (Multiple Points of Diversion) to the Pyramid Lake inlet as shown on the map accompanying Application No. 67182, filed in the office of the Nevada Division of Water Resources.**
8. Existing place of use **See attached Exhibit "B" as described in Application No. 62141 and shown on supporting map accompanying said application on file with the Division of Water Resources, State of Nevada.**
9. Use will be from **July 1 to November 15** of each year.
10. Use was permitted from **January 1 to December 31** of each year.
11. Description of proposed works. **Water remains in the river and is not diverted by TMWA; therefore, no other works are proposed.**
12. Estimated cost of works **N/a**
13. Estimated time required to construct works **N/a**
14. Estimated time required to complete the application of water to beneficial use **4 months**

APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions.

This temporary permit to change the place of use and manner of use of the waters of the Truckee River as heretofore granted under Permit 66157, which changed the point of diversion and place of use of Permit 23657, Certificate 6353, which changed the point of diversion of Permit 19424, Certificate 5267, which changed the point of diversion, place of use and manner of use of a portion of Claim 606 of the Truckee River Decree, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said decree and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein.

This temporary permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this temporary permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The issuance of this temporary permit fully abrogates 556.8 acre-feet annually under Permit 66157, which fully abrogated 556.8 acre-feet annually under Permit 23657, Certificate 6353, which fully abrogated 556.8 acre-feet annually under Permit 19424, Certificate 5267, which fully abrogated 556.8 acre-feet per season associated with 139.2 acres under Truckee River Claims 606 & 606a.

The issuance of this temporary permit is for the consumptive use portion only, being 2.5 acre-feet per acre of the 139.2 acres under Claims 606 & 606a.

The remaining portion of the base right will remain in the river for use by other decreed right holders.

This temporary permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of NRS 533.345 Section 2 and will expire on **November 15, 2003** at which time all rights herein granted shall revert to the right being changed by this temporary permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 3.48 cubic feet per second, but not to exceed 348.0 acre feet per season.




EXHIBIT "A"

The following describes the multiple points of diversion for Sierra Pacific Power Company Water Treatment Plants, which are shown on the map accompanying Application No. 58882 on file with the State of Nevada, Division of Water Resources, more particularly described as follows:

STEAMBOAT CANAL (HUNTER CREEK RESERVOIR):

The existing point of diversion is situate within the Northeast one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 31, T.19N., R.18E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion, the Southeast corner of said Section 31 bears South 62°04' East, a distance of 3,195.00 feet.

HIGHLAND DITCH (HIGHLAND RESERVOIR):

The existing point of diversion is situate within the Southwest one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 9, T.19N., R.18E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion, the Southeast corner of said Section 9 bears South 75°16' East, a distance of 1,650.00 feet.

IDLEWILD TREATMENT PLANT:

The existing point of diversion is situate within the Southeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 10, T.19N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion, the Southeast corner of said Section 10 bears South 69°57'58" East, a distance of 842.34 feet.

NORTH TRUCKEE DITCH (GLENDALE TREATMENT PLANT):

The existing point of diversion is situate within the Southwest one-quarter of the Northeast one-quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 7, T.19N., R.20E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion, the Northeast corner of said Section 7 bears North 39°28' East, a distance of 3,015.00 feet.

ORR DITCH PUMP STATION (CHALK BLUFF TREATMENT PLANT):

The point of diversion is situate within the Northeast one-quarter of the Southeast one-quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 17, T.19N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion the Northeast corner of said Section 17 bears North 15°39'36" East, a distance of 3,264.77 feet.

ORR DITCH (CHALK BLUFF TREATMENT PLANT):

The point of diversion is situate within the Northeast one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 17, T.19N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., Washoe County, Nevada, from said point of diversion the Southwest corner of said Section 17 bears South 44°40' West, a distance of 3,211.00 feet.

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Exhibit "C"

For the purposes of calculating diverted flow under the Truckee River Agreement, this water right, both the consumptive and non-consumptive portions shall continue to be considered as diverted at its existing point of diversion.

This Temporary Application changes the consumptive use portion of the total duty of Permit No. 66157. The consumptive portion is equal to or less than 62.5% of the permitted right. The water is allowed to flow past TMWA's existing Points of Diversion and remain flowing in the river to Pyramid Lake for wildlife habitat and fish recovery in the river. The period of use begins July 1, 2003 through November 15, 2003 subject to the condition that no more than 25% of the amount will be used in any month.

TMWA reserves the right to withdraw this Temporary Application prior to issuance of the Permit should the water be needed for municipal purposes.
