### PERMIT TO CHANGE POINT OF DIVERSION, MANNER OF USE AND PLACE OF USE OF THE PUBLIC WATERS OF THE STATE OF NEVADA HERETOFORE APPROPRIATED

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#### APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit to change the point of diversion of the waters of The MEADOW VALLEY WASH CREEK as heretofore granted under Permit 69337 is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 69337 and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. A totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins or before the proof of completion of work is filed.

Monthly records shall be kept of the amount of water diverted from this source and the records submitted to the State Engineer on a quarterly basis within 15 days after the end of each calendar quarter.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The total combined duty of water from the underground sources under Permits 73068, 73069, 73834, 75193 and 75194 shall not exceed 1,011.0 acre-feet annually. The total combined duty of water from both the underground and surface water sources under Permits 73068, 73069, 73834, 75193, 75194 and 75195 shall not exceed 1,100.0 acre-feet annually. This term is specifically to clarify the maximum amount of underground water that may be diverted and the amount of water that may be used conjunctively when surface water is available.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The point of diversion and place of use is as described under items 5 & 7 respectively on the submitted application to support this permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed 5.4 cubic feet per second, but not to exceed 1100.0 acre-feet annually.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and proof of completion of work shall be filed on or before:

May 16, 2009

Water must be placed to beneficial use and proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before:



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The applicant **Diamond Water, LLC** hereby makes application for permission to change the **Point of diversion** of water heretofore appropriated under **Permit 69337**

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1. The source of water is **Meadow Valley Wash Creek**
2. The amount of water to be changed **1,100.00 acre feet per year at 5.4 cubic feet per second**
3. The water to be used for **Commercial**
4. The water heretofore permitted for **Commercial**
5. The water is to be diverted at the following point **within the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 19, Township 13 South, Range 66 East M.D.B.&M., Clark County, Nevada, or at a point from which the northeast corner of said Section 19 bears North 22° 43' 58" East a distance of 1631.53 feet**
6. The existing permitted point of diversion is located **within the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 19, Township 13 South, Range 66 East, M.D.B.&M., Clark County, Nevada or at a point from which the northeast corner of said Section 19 bears North 78° 30' 00" East a distance of 1724.0 feet**
7. Proposed place of use **NE ¼ (all), NE ¼ NW ¼, N ½ SE ¼, and the SE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 19, Township 13 South, Range 66 East, M.D.B.&M, Clark County, Nevada**
8. Existing place of use **NE ¼ (all), NE ¼ NW ¼, N ½ SE ¼, and the SE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 19, Township 13 South, Range 66 East, M.D.B.&M, Clark County, Nevada**
9. Use will be from **January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>** of each year.
10. Use was permitted from **January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>** of each year.
11. Description of proposed works **Water will be pumped from the creek to a lined storage pond, then by means of a second pump to the sand plant, then a clarifying unit, then recycled to the storage pond.**
12. Estimated cost of works **\$400,000.00**
13. Estimated time required to construct works **2 years**
14. Estimated time required to complete the application of water to beneficial use **5 years**

15. Remarks: **The proposed new Point of Diversion is in the creek bed. Meadow Valley Wash Creek is normally dry, but a pump would be placed in the creek bed during the occasional flow periods. The occasional flow periods are often preceded by destructive flood flows which make diversion via a weir impractical. The water will be used for operation of the sand plant, concrete batch plant, and related operations. There are no domestic diversions within 2,500 feet of the proposed Point of Diversion.**
