This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This temporary permit, to change the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of the waters of the Truckee River as heretofore granted under Claim 601, Truckee River Final Decree, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said decree and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. Before any use of the water begins, a totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of the waters placed to beneficial use.

This temporary permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this temporary permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

This temporary permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of NRS 533.345 Section 2 and will expire on **December 31, 2010**, at which time all rights herein granted shall revert to the right being changed by this temporary permit.

Temporary Permits 79765T and 79766T are issued subject to the availability of water as determined by the Federal Water Master.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.



DECREE CLAIM 601

Item 15. Proposed Project Description

This application is one of three (3) being filed concurrently to temporarily change a portion of Truckee River Decree Claim 601, proposed to be diverted from a new point of diversion in the Truckee River. The three changes are proposed to be used supplementally from three new points of diversion for the irrigation of approximately 52.6 acres of riparian area to be extensively planted with trees, shrubs and grasses for rehabilitation of natural vegetation. Water will be delivered and applied to the project site by installation of temporary pumps in the Truckee River channel and surface-laid PVC distribution pipe with sprinkler systems.

The projected combined supplemental water use total under the three applications of 170 ac-ft is based on the application of the Claim 601 duty of up to 4.0038 AF/Ac. for irrigation demand during the period allowed under provisions of the Truckee River Decree.

This is part of The Nature Conservancy's continuing efforts at the 102 Ranch and to assist in the improvement of water quality in the Truckee River. This project is a cooperative effort of The Nature Conservancy, the City of Reno, and the University of Nevada, Reno.

The water sought by this application will be utilized in conjunction with the 350 AFA currently allowed under three existing Temporary Permits 78041T, 78042T and 78043T, which were issued to temporarily move water from the University's Main Farm area to be used for the ongoing rehabilitation effort by The Nature Conservancy at the downstream McCarran Ranch site. Furthermore this application is intended to be used in conjunction with pending Temporary

Applications 79694T, 79695T and 79696T that have been filed to replace Temporary Permits 78041T-43T, which will expire on April 27, 2010. Although the Point of Diversion and Place of Use at the 102 Ranch site under this application is different from those allowed at McCarran Ranch under Temporary Permits 78041T-78043T or proposed under pending Applications 79694T-96T, the total combined duty of water diverted to use at the two sites will not exceed 350 AFA. It is understood that:

- The temporary diversion and acre-foot total sought under this application will revert from Temporary Permits 78041T and 78042T back to Decree Claim 601 prior to issuance of this temporary permit.
- Water rights ultimately granted under pending Temporary Applications 79694T and 79695T will not include the diversion and acre-foot total allowed under this and other supplemental 102 Ranch temporary applications.
- The diversion and acre-foot total allowed under existing Temporary Permits 78041T and 78042T, as well as rights allowed under pending Temporary Applications 79694T and 79695T, will be reduced by the amount of the diversion rate and acre-feet allowed under this application, and that
- The total combined duty allowed under Temporary Permits 78041T-78043T or pending Temporary Applications 79694T-96T will be reduced by the duty allowed under this application.

It is also understood that water to be changed by this application is to be subject to the availability of water as determined by the Federal Water Master.

The duty of water under Claims 601 and 607 is 4.0038 acre-feet per acre and 1.0039 acre-feet per acre, respectively. Although this application, along with Permit 78041T, 78042T and 78043T (or pending Temporary Applications 79694T-96T) propose the removal of 53.78 acres and 134.81 acres from the irrigated areas under Claims 601 and 607, the duty proposed for transfer will be limited to 350 AFA as allowed under lease by The Nature Conservancy for the Truckee River restoration projects.

Please use Truckee River Decree Maps TR-045 and TR-046, and use the map under Permit 67182 on file at the Division of Water Resources, to support the existing point of diversion and place of use.
