APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit to change the point of diversion, place and manner of use of a portion of the waters of an underground source as heretofore granted under Permit 66422 is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 66422 and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. The well shall be equipped with a 2-inch opening and a totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins or before the proof of completion of work is filed. If the well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. This source is located within an area designated by the State Engineer pursuant to NRS 534.030. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

Any well drilled under this permit shall be drilled in what has been described in the United States Geological Survey Water Supply Paper 2263 as the intermediate alluvial aquifer. In no instance shall the seal on this well be less than 100 feet below ground level.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, **and not to exceed 0.1468 cubic feet per second or 25.0 acre-feet annually.**

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and proof of completion of work shall be filed on or before:

April 18 2015

Water must be placed to beneficial use and proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before:





Item 4 – How much time is needed to construct the works of diversion or place the water to beneficial use?

Permit No. 66422 has been approved for 34.4 acre-feet of quasi-municipal water to serve residential, commercial and other municipal customers within the place of use. Churchill County intends to extend the infrastructure, municipal water lines and sewer facilities to the proposed place of use under Permit No. 66422. Portions of the sewer treatment facility have been completed, along with municipal water lines completed to multiple locations within properties owned by the Travis Family.

The amount of time required to complete the works of diversion and file proof of beneficial use. Due to the nationwide economic downturn, residential and commercial development has declined substantially. The decline in development has directly impacted the Travis Family's ability to obtain financing, maintain cash flow and provide sufficient resources to continue with the planned development. As economic and financing conditions improve, the Travis Family will be able to continue development plans within the proposed place of use.

In efforts to maintain the good standing of their water rights until the development of municipal infrastructure, the Travis family filed Permit Nos. 82158 and 82159 which moves their quasi-municipal water back to irrigation purposes. The Travis Family also entered into another multi-year water right lease agreement with Mr. Troy Adams for 25 acre-feet of Permit No. 66422. The new lease agreement, signed October 2, 2013, is for a minimum of five (5) years, with the option to extend the lease at the end of the five year term. Application to Change No. 83158 was filed to change the point of diversion, manner and place of use of a portion of Permit No. 66422 to Mr. Troy Adams' property and well where the water will be beneficially utilized for commercial purposes.

Item 5 – What is the expenditure on the project under this permit? Last year? Total to date?

Over the last 9 years, a total of approximately \$250,000.00 has been invested by the Travis Family. The Travis Family along with Churchill County has invested several millions of dollars in municipal water line extension, sewer treatment plant construction,

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engineering, surveying, zoning changes and required master planning to further the completion of the project.

To further demonstrate the Travis Family's intent to utilize their water rights, the Travis family has spent several thousand dollars on applications to change, permitting fees, field rehabilitation and sprinkler irrigation systems, to diligently utilize the water previously designated for development until the return of development opportunities.

Additional funding investments into this project is anticipated, as economic conditions improve, and the demand for municipal water supplies increase due to the construction of residential, commercial and municipal facilities.

Item 7 – Describe progress made during the last year and explain in detail why this request for an extension of time is being submitted.

Current economic conditions have limited residential and commercial development and growth within Churchill County, and more specifically the development planned by the Travis Family. The Travis Family has filed Permit Nos. 82158 and 82159 to change the designated development water to irrigation until development within the Churchill County area resumes. The Travis Family has also leased 25.0 acre-feet of their remaining quasi-municipal water under Permit No. 66422 to Mr. Troy Adams. Within the next six to twelve months, an application to change the remaining 9.40 acre-feet for irrigation purposes is anticipated.

The Travis Family is respectfully requesting an extension of time of one (1) year, for the filing of proof of completion of works and proof of beneficial use under permit No. 66422 to allow for the economic conditions to improve and to honor the lease agreement with Mr. Troy Adams.
