APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit, to change the point of diversion, place and manner of use of a portion of the waters of an underground source as heretofore granted under Permit 31042, Certificate 9185, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 31042, Certificate 9185, and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. The well shall be equipped with a 2-inch opening and a totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins or before the proof of completion of work is filed. If the well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. This source is located within an area designated by the State Engineer pursuant to NRS 534.030. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

The permittee shall keep monthly records of the amount of water pumped from this well and the records submitted to the State Engineer on an annual basis by February 15th of each year.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The total combined duty of water under Permit 78697, Certificate 19491; Permit 78701, Certificate 19508; Permit 78703, Certificate 19509; Permits 78977, 78979, 78981, Permit 82297, Certificate 19511; Permits 83587, 83806, 83807 and 83808 shall not exceed 250.99 acre-feet annually for the commercial cultivation of lawn sod within the described place of use.

The total amount of water that may be diverted from this well for the commercial cultivation of lawn sod under Permit 78697, Certificate 19491; Permit 78703, Certificate 19509; Permit 78979, Permit 82297, Certificate 19511; Permit 83807 and Permit 83808 shall not exceed 131.64 acre-feet annually.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, **and not to exceed 0.00436 cubic feet per second or 3.15 acre-feet annually.**


Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and proof of completion of work shall be filed on or before: **Filed Under 82297 on July 17, 2013**

Water must be placed to beneficial use and proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before: **January 25, 2018**



Water rights are to be used for the Dayton Valley Turf operation within the entire extent of the property. Water rights are being leased from Jack L. Ruppert and Thomas H. Eitel from this source. Dayton Valley Turf acquired additional water rights to stem off any over-pumpage and for future expansion of the project. Since demand for turfgrass varies year to year, other crops may be produced on a crop rotation basis. Acknowledgments of Lease Agreements between Jack L. Ruppert & Dayton Valley Turf Inc. and Thomas H. Eitel & Dayton Valley Turf Inc. will be forthcoming. Jack L. Ruppert is the owner of 1.0579 AFA and Thomas H. Eitel is the owner of 2.0948 AFA.
