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**APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER**

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This diversion rate only permit, to change the point of diversion of the waters of an underground source as heretofore granted under Permit 79817, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 79817 and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. This well shall be equipped with a two (2) inch opening for measuring depth to water. A totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins or before the proof of completion of work is filed. If the well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. This source is located within an area designated by the State Engineer pursuant to NRS 534.030. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The total combined duty of water under Permits 79762, 79763, 79814, 79815, 83982, 83983, 83984 and 83985, having the same place of use, shall not exceed 128.85 acre-feet annually.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

If any water under this permit is cancelled or any water is not put to beneficial use, it will revert to the groundwater source and not back to the base water right.

This permit is issued for commercial purposes within the described place of use, further identified by the Clark County Assessor as APN 177-12-201-002.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, **and not to exceed 0.0183 cubic feet per second or 13.25 acre-feet annually.**







The water is to be used for an existing memorial park (cemetery). The primary use of the water will be for landscape irrigation, but water will also be used for other operating needs of the park, including mandated dust control on the un-landscaped portion of the park.

16. Miscellaneous remarks:

The intention of this application (and another simultaneously submitted application) is to swap the points of diversion between Permits 79816 and 79817. The intent is to put the oldest priority date with the higher yielding of the two wells, thereby assuring that a proof of beneficial use can be completed sooner for the oldest priority date permit.

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
