

250 acres lying within portions of SW1/4 and W1/2SE1/4 of Section 29, portions of the SE1/4 of Section 30, portions of the NE1/4NE1/4 of Section 31 and portions of the N1/2NW1/4 and NW1/4NE1/4 of Section 32 all in T.41N., R.42E., M.D.B.&M.

7. Use will begin about January 1st and end about December 31st of each year.

Applicant plans to use an existing irrigation well and install 2 new circular sprinklers to replace the 2 collapsed sprinklers.

9. Estimated cost of works: \$150,000.00±

10. Estimated time required to construct works: 2 year, well is complete, no well log is available
(If the well is complete, describe works.)

11. Estimated time required to complete the application of water to beneficial use: 3 years

12. Provide a detailed description of the proposed project and its water usage (use attachments if necessary): (Failure to provide a detailed description may cause a delay in processing.)

Applicant proposes to use an existing irrigation well (well may have been drilled under Permit 26063, Permit 26064 or Permit 36798) and replace 2 old circular sprinklers that have collapsed. This application is supplemental to portions of Proofs 0704, 0704A, 0704F, 0704G and portions of Permit 48545. The annual consumptive use will not exceed 3.6 acre feet per acre from all sources. See additional information under miscellaneous remarks.

13. Miscellaneous remarks:

Permit 36798 refers to 2 circular sprinklers, however the location is different from the sprinklers found on the ground no well was found at the point of diversion of Permit 36798. The tie to the existing well is close to the tie for the well proposed under Permit 26063, however the only well log for a well that was completed and cased was for Permit 26064.


