This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This temporary permit, to change the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of the waters of the Truckee River as heretofore granted under Claims 603/604, Truckee River Final Decree, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said decree and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. Before any use of the water begins, a totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of the waters placed to beneficial use.

This temporary permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of NRS 533.345 Section 2 and will expire on December 31, 2016, at which time all rights herein granted shall revert to the right being changed by this temporary permit.

This temporary permit is subject to the continuing jurisdiction by the Federal Water Master and the State Engineer.

This temporary permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this temporary permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.



**ATTACHMENT TO TEMPORARY APPLICATION TO CHANGE TRUCKEE
RIVER DECREE CLAIM 603/604**

Item 5. The water is to be diverted at three (3) separate locations described as follows:

- (1) SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, T. 19N., R. 21E., M.D.M., at a point from which the West quarter corner of said Section 11 bears S. 69° 50' 10" W, a distance of 1,565 feet.
- (2) NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, T. 19N., R. 21E., M.D.M., at a point from which the west corner of said Section 11 bears N. 86° 10' 17" W, a distance of 1,095 feet.
- (3) NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, T. 19N., R. 21E., M.D.M., at a point from which the west corner of Section 11 bears N. 22° 31' 09" W, a distance of 663 feet.

Item 15: Proposed Project Description

This application is filed to temporarily change a portion of Truckee River Decree Claim 603/604, proposed to be diverted from three separate new points of diversion on the Truckee River channel. The change is proposed to provide water for the irrigation of approximately 30 acres of riparian area to be extensively planted with trees, shrubs and grasses for rehabilitation of natural vegetation. As described by the supporting map, all three diversions will be located along the new river channel segment resulting from the recently constructed restoration project (one the south bank of the river channel, two on the north bank) for irrigation of a single contiguous area.

Water will be delivered and applied to the project site by installation of temporary pumps in the Truckee River channel and through surface-laid distribution pipelines with sprinkler systems.

The projected water use total from the three diversions will not exceed 100 acre-feet as allowed under Claim 603/604, for irrigation demand during the period allowed under provisions of the Truckee River Decree.

This represents a part of the Nature Conservancy's continuing restoration efforts at the West McCarran project site, and to assist in the improvement of water quality in the Truckee River. This project is a cooperative effort of The Nature Conservancy, the City of Reno, and the University of Nevada, Reno. The water rights under Claim 603/604, which are the subject of this application, are a portion of the total of 350 acre-feet under Truckee River Decree Claims 603/604 allowed under lease by The Nature Conservancy for Truckee River restoration projects.
