APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This temporary permit, to change the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of the waters of an underground source as heretofore granted under Permit 41870, Certificate 11871, is issued subject to the terms and conditions imposed in said Permit 41870, Certificate 11871, and with the understanding that no other rights on the source will be affected by the change proposed herein. This well shall be equipped with a two (2) inch opening for measuring depth to water. A totalizing meter must be installed and maintained in the discharge pipeline near the point of diversion and accurate measurements must be kept of water placed to beneficial use. The totalizing meter must be installed before any use of the water begins. If the well is flowing, a valve must be installed and maintained to prevent waste. This source is located within an area designated by the State Engineer pursuant to NRS 534.030.

The permittee shall keep monthly records of the amount of water pumped from this well and the records submitted to the State Engineer on an annual basis.

This temporary permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of NRS 533.345 Section 2 and will expire 1 year after the approval of the permit at which time all rights herein granted shall revert to the right being changed by this temporary permit.

This temporary permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The issuance of this temporary permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.



This Application is being filed to support the need for water use within the Pine Valley portion of the twin declines and exploration drifts to be constructed for underground mineral exploration. These underground declines will begin in Grass Valley and end in Pine Valley. The water under this application will come from and be used within Pine Valley Hydrographic Basin #53. Water under this application will be used underground for drilling, dust control, and related exploration needs. The point of diversion is approximately 500 feet below land surface.
A permanent application is being filed concurrently.


