CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Edward Thomarson, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from a Spring, in the NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 13, T.4 N, R.67 E, M.D.B. & M. through the open-cut and ditch, pipe-line, flume ( ) for irrigation, power, stock ( mining ) and domestic purposes, the point of diversion named in said application being as follows: At the Spring, in the NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 13, T.4 N, R.67 E, MD.B. & M., and bears S, 78° 14' W, 3600 feet from N.W. corner of Section 18, T.4 N, R.68 E, M.D.B. & M.

situated in Lincoln County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter XVIII, Statutes of 1907, has determined the amount of such appropriation as follows:

Description of irrigated land

Description of use other than irrigation Water is diverted at the spring and conducted through an open-cut 5 1/2' wide x 3' deep x 73' long, thence through a pipe 2" dia. x 32' long, thence to a trough 1' x 1' x 15' long, and there used for mining and domestic purposes.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to mining and domestic purposes, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired; rights for irrigation not to exceed three acre-feet per year for each acre of land for which appropriation is herein determined. Continued title to water depends upon beneficial use of water appropriated.
