CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Thomas Dixon, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Summit Springs, (Main & Second Springs) on unsurveyed land, through a tunnel and open-cut ~~ditch, pipe line, flume~~ for ~~irrigation, power, stock~~ ~~and domestic~~ purposes, the point of diversion named in said application being as follows: At the springs, Main Spring is S 44° 38' E, 22266 feet from the U.S. Mineral Monument No. 1 on Ruby Hill, and Spring No. 2 is S 35° E, 260 feet, from Main Spring, Ruby Hill is about 5 miles S. E. from the town of Eureka.

Eureka, situated in Eureka, County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter XVIII, Statutes of 1907, has determined the amount of such appropriation as follows:

Description of use other than irrigation Water is diverted at the springs, and conducted from Spring No. 2 by a trench to Main Spring, and from Main Spring by a Tunnel 225 feet long x 3 feet wide x 5 feet 10 in. deep to place of use, and there used for Watering Livestock.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to Watering Livestock.

_____, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired; rights for irrigation not to exceed three acre-feet per year for each acre of land for which appropriation is herein determined. Continued title to water depends upon beneficial use of water appropriated.
