THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Gentile Georgetta has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Crow Springs (A group) through the Georgetta Reservoirs for stockwatering and domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: from Crow Spring in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 33, T. 23 N., R. 70 E., MDB&M. and from North Crow Springs in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Sec. 6, T. 22 N., R. 70 E., MDB&M. situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter 18, Statutes of 1907 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Gentile Georgetta. Postoffice address: Ipanah, Tooele County, Utah. Amount of appropriation: 0.025 cubic foot per second from each spring. Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year. Date of priority of appropriation: January 27th, 1910.

Description of works of diversion and use: At Crow Spring there is a reservoir 15 feet by 10 feet by one foot deep into which the water of the spring flows through the natural channel of the stream. At North Crow Spring there is a reservoir 10 feet by 10 feet by one foot deep into which the water of the spring flows through the natural channel of the stream.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.

WHEREAS, Gentile Georgetta has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from

CROW SPRINGS (A group)

through the Georgetta Reservoirs ditch, pipe-line, flume () for

~~irrigation, power, stock~~ (Stockwatering) and domestic purposes, the point of diversion named in said

application being as follows: Crow Spring lies N. 82° 35' W. 18,400 feet from the 109 mile post on the Nevada-Utah state line. North Crow Spring lies N. 84° 45' W. 22,200 feet from the 109 mile post on Nevada-Utah State line. There is one reservoir at each as appears in note below, situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter XVIII, Statutes of 1907, has determined the amount of such appropriation as follows:

Name of appropriator Gentile Georgetta,

Postoffice address Ibapah, Tooele County, Utah.

Amount of appropriation 0.025 cubic feet per second from each spring

Date of appropriation January 27th, 1910.

Description of irrigated land None.

Note: At Crow Spring there is a reservoir 15 feet by 10 feet by one foot deep into which the water of the spring flows through the natural channel of the stream.

At North Crow Spring there is a reservoir 10 feet by 10 feet by one foot deep into which the water of the spring flows through the natural channel of the stream.

Description of use other than irrigation Watering Stock and Domestic purposes.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to Stockwatering and Domestic purposes,

and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired; rights for irrigation not to exceed three acre-feet per year for each acre of land for which appropriation is herein determined. Continued title to water depends upon beneficial use of water appropriated.
