

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Martin Christopher has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from

EAST FORK OF ROCK CREEK

through the Christopher pipe line ditch, pipe line, flume (& tanks) for

irrigation, power, stock (townsite) and domestic purposes, the point of diversion named in said

application being as follows: From the East Fork of Rock Creek in the NE¹/₄ of Section

4, T. 29. N.R. 46 E., M.D.B & M.

situated in Lander County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter XVIII, Statutes of 1907, has determined the amount of such appropriation as follows:

Name of appropriator Martin Christopher

Postoffice address Hill Top, Lander County, Nevada.

Amount of appropriation (0.10) One tenth of a cubic foot per second.

Date of appropriation May 13th, 1908.

Description of irrigated land None.

Note: The water is used for townsite purposes in the town of Hill Top. There is a distributing system through a portion of the town consisting of pipe one and two inches in diameter. The Main pipe leading to the town is 4 inches in diameter for a distance of 200 feet, and 1400 feet of 2 1/2 inch pipe. Also there is 500 feet of ditch 18 inches wide by 24 inches deep.

Description of use other than irrigation Townsite and domestic purposes.

The water is used for household purposes, also for irrigating small flower gardens.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to Townsite and domestic purposes

and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired; rights for irrigation not to exceed three acre-feet per year for each acre of land for which appropriation is herein determined. Continued title to water depends upon beneficial use of water appropriated.
