CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, G.W. Warmoth and J.J. Wilson have ~~xxx~~ presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Willow Springs in Seven Troughs Canyon through the by means of a ditch, pipe-line, flume () for irrigation, power, stock () and domestic purposes, the point of diversion named in said application, being as follows: at a point from which the SW Cor. of Sec. 31, T. 31 N. R. 29 E., M. D. E. & M. bears N. 26° - 41' E., 11363 feet. situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 29, Chapter XVIII, Statutes of 1907, has determined the amount of such appropriation as follows:

Name of appropriator: G.W. Warmoth and J.J. Wilson.
Postoffice address: Seven Troughs, Humboldt Co., Nevada.
Amount of appropriation: 0.10 (1/10) cubic foot per second.
Date of appropriation: May 22nd., 1912.

Description of irrigated land works; -
Water is diverted from the spring through a pipe-line 1 1/2 inches in diameter and 5160 feet long, having a maximum grade of 10%. The water is used as a domestic supply for a part of the town of Seven Troughs, in Humboldt Co., Nevada.

Description of use other than irrigation; -
The water is used on a few small lawns and garden patches in connection with the domestic supply.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to such times of the year as it can be beneficially used, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired; rights for irrigation not to exceed three acre-feet per year for each acre of land for which appropriation is herein determined. Continued title to water depends upon beneficial use of water appropriated.
