CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Nevada Consolidated Copper Company has presented to the State Engineer
of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from
Pine Spring
through the Pine Spring Pipe Line for
mining and domestic
purposes, the point of diversion of water from the source as follows: at N. 88°-24'-32" E.
10462.18 feet from the SE corner, Sec. 33, T. 15 N. R. 62 E., M.D.B. & M.
situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913,
as amended by Chapter 253, Statutes of 1915, has determined the date, source, purpose, and amount of such
appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Nevada Consolidated Copper Company.
Postoffice address McGill, White Pine County, Nevada.
Amount of appropriation 0.011 cubic foot per second.
Period of use, from January 1st. to December 1st. of each year
Date of priority of appropriation October 27th., 1915.

Description of irrigated land to which water is appurtenant is as follows: works: The pipe line
which conveys the water of Pine Spring is part of a system which also
conveys the water of Mountain and High Springs, Certificates Nos.
299 and 300, which system joins the Holt Creek Pipe Line at South
Spring appropriated under Permit No. 300 in the State Engineer's
Office. The water from Pine Spring passes through 530 feet of 2
inch pipe, thence through approximately 8800 feet of 4 inch pipe,
thence through approximately 4100 feet of 2 1/2 inch pipe, thence
through 3908 feet of 2 inch pipe, to junction with the Holt Creek
Pipe Line: Average grade of the 4 inch pipe is from 3 1/4 to 5 1/3
per cent., that of the 2 1/2 inch pipe is 4 per cent. and that of the
2 inch pipe is 1 7/8 per cent.

The water from Pine Spring, in conjunction with that from
other sources, continues on through the Holt Creek Pipe Line, it being
8 inches in diameter and approximately 40000 feet long, for use at
the applicants' mines in the Robinson Mining District, in White
Pine County, Nevada.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to
exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose
for which acquired.
