

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, John Connolly, for the Kawich Cattle ^{Association} has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from
 Cliff Springs
 through a tunnel and pipe-line for stock-watering and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source ^{being} as follows: at S. 33° W., 2.5 miles from the SW corner of Sec. 31, T. 4 S. R. 53 E., M. D. B. & M. situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913, as amended by Chapter 253, Statutes of 1915, has determined the date, source, purpose, and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Kawich Cattle Association.
 Postoffice address Goldfield, Esmeralda Co., Nevada.
 Amount of appropriation 0.01 (1/100) cubic foot per second.
 Period of use, from Jan. 1st, to Dec. 31st, of each year
 Date of priority of appropriation February 28th, 1912.

Description of ~~project~~ ~~land~~ ~~to~~ ~~which~~ ~~water~~ ~~is~~ ~~appurtenant~~ ~~is~~ ~~as~~ ~~follows~~: works: Water is developed and collected by means of a small tunnel from which it is diverted into a 1-inch pipe-line whereby it is conveyed in a north-westerly direction about 1000 feet to the place of use in tubs. The average grade or fall of the pipe-line is about five per cent.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
