CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, J. W. Clarke has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from French Boy Canon Spring through a pipe line for milling and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, T. 28 N. R. 37 E., M.D.B & M. situated in Pershing County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913, as amended by Chapter 253, Statutes of 1915, has determined the date, source, purpose, and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation one fortieth of a cubic foot per second (0.025)
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation February 5, 1918.

Description of irrigated land to which water is appurtenant is as follows: works by which the water is beneficially used:

The source of the water is in a deep gully, caused by a cloud burst, thereby creating a small spring, the waters of which are diverted by a one inch pipe line, about six hundred feet in length, and conveyed to a water tank, from whence it is distributed thru subsidiary pipe lines to reduction works and boarding house in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11, T. 28 N. R. 37 E., M.D.B & M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
