CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Wm. Lamb has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Twin Springs through Twin Springs Pipeline for Stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: at a point near the S part of the SW 1/4 Sec. 24, T.5 S, R.62 E, unsurveyed, from whence the SE cor. of T.4 S, R.62 E, bears N 5° E, 23120 feet situated in Lincoln County, State of Nevada:

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913, has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator William Lamb
Postoffice address Alamo, Lincoln County, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.003 of a cubic foot of water per second

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year, inclusive

Date of priority of appropriation October 13th, 1917

Description of works of diversion and use: Water is conveyed from the springs through 200' of 1" pipe to a cement trough 40' x 40' x 3' deep, where it is conserved for watering 100 head of cattle.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
