CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, B. H. Hummel has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Dwyer Spring through Pump and Pipeline for Mining and Domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Sec. 6, T. 34 N., R. 31 E., M.D.B. & M. Pershing County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: J. F. Dwyer
Postoffice address: 1225 Citizens' National Bank Bldg., Los Angeles, California.
Amount of appropriation: 0.125 cubic foot per second
Period of use, from: January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: September 13, 1919

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is pumped from a well 4 feet x 4 feet x 28 feet deep at site of spring to a tank situated about 100 feet above. The camp and mine are served by gravity flow through a one inch pipe being about 500 feet in length over all.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
