

THE STATE OF NEVADA
CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, John E. Nay has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Thunder Mountain Spring through troughs and reservoir for stockwatering purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 12, T. 4 N., R. 44 E., M.D.B. & M. situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator S. W. A. Marsh and John E. Nay
Postoffice address Tonopah, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.015 cubic foot per second
Period of use, from April 1st to December 1st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation June 29, 1920

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is conveyed from an open cut 3 feet wide, 4 feet deep and 30 feet long to a reservoir 20 feet by 20 feet by 4 feet deep. From this point water is delivered to 40 feet of troughs through a 30 foot pipeline and conserved in this manner for 2500 sheep.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
