

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Louis A. Yelland has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Willow Spring through Willow Spring Channel for stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: at the spring which bears S. 51° 21' 40" W., 30,751 feet from a post on the Nevada Utah line marked thus 11 U.G.C. situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 150, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Louis A. Yelland
Postoffice address Aurum, Nevada
Amount of appropriation .018 cubic foot per second
Period of use, from March 15th to October 1st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation April 26, 1920

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is conserved by damming the natural channel in three places forming drinking pools. The dams are about 10 feet long and two feet high. 3000 head of sheep are watered in this manner.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
