CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Louis A. Yelland has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Lower Sulphur Spring through Spring Channel for stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: at the spring which bears S. 22°14'W. 34,125 feet from a post on the Nevada Utah State line situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada. marked thus N 11 U.C.S.C. IIII

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Louis A. Yelland
Postoffice address Aurum, Nevada
Amount of appropriation .018 cubic foot per second
Period of use, from March 15th to October 1st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation April 26, 1920

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Three earthen dams, about 10 feet long and 2 feet high, are built across the spring channel forming pools. Water is conserved in this manner for 3000 head of sheep.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
