CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS John B. Dangberg has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Mineral Hill Spring

through pipe to troughs for Stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 Sec. 30, T. 14 N., R. 22 E., M.D.B. & M. or S. 64° 20' E., 7620 ft. from the N 1/2 Cor. Sec. 25, T. 14 N., R. 21 E., M.D.B. & M.

situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913

has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator H. T. Dangberg Land and Livestock Co.

Post-office address Minden, Douglas County, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.05 C.F.S. OR sufficient to water 5000 sheep, 500 cattle, and 100 horses.

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation May 4, 1916.

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is conveyed from the spring in the NE 1/4 Sec. 30, T. 14 N., R. 22 E., M.D.B. & M., through a 2 inch pipe line 12 ft. long to 128 ft. of wooden troughs where it is used for the watering of 5000 sheep, 500 cattle, and 100 horses.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
