CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, John B. Langberg has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from

Badger Spring through pipe line to troughs for Stockwatering purposes

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 29, T. 15 N. R. 21 E., M.D.B. & M., or N. 39° 52' W., 13412 ft. from the NE Corner of Sec. 4, T. 14 N., R. 21 E., M.D.B. & M. situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140 Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source,

purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator H. F. Dan-berg Land and Livestock Co.

Post-office address Minden, Douglas County, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.05 C.F.S. or sufficient to water 5000 sheep, 500 cattle and 100 horses

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation May 4, 1916

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:  
Water is conveyed from the spring in the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 29, T. 15 N., R. 21 E., M.D.B. & M., through 30 ft. of 2 inch pipe, 96 ft. of flume to 144 ft. of galvanized iron troughs where it is used for the watering of 5000 sheep, 500 cattle and 100 head of horses.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
