CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Ernest H. Simonsen has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use: from Willow Spring

through reservoir, pipeline to troughs for Stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 Sec. 33, T. 23 N., R. 55 E., M.D.B. & M., unsurveyed, or N. 64°25' W., 10164 feet, from the SE corner Sec. 34, T. 23 N., R. 55 E., M.D.B. & M.

situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Ernest H. Simonsen
Post-office address Simonsen, White Pine County, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.025 C.F.S. or sufficient to water 2500 head of sheep and 300 head of cattle
Period of use, from March 1 to December 1 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation July 23, 1915.

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
An earthen reservoir was constructed at the spring located in the NE 1/4 Sec. 33, T. 23 N., R. 55 E., M.D.B. & M., from where the water is conveyed through 20 feet of iron pipe to 80 feet of galvanized iron stock troughs 1 1/2 ft. wide, where it is used for the watering of 2500 head of sheep and 300 head of cattle.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
