CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Bertrand Paris by H. M. Payne has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from High Rock Spring through sump, pipeline and troughs for stockwatering purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NE 1/4, Sec. 34, T. 26 N., R. 63 E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point which bears N. 33° 59' E., 24,503 ft. from NE Corner of Section 24, T. 25 N., R. 62 E., M.D.B. & M. situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator BERTRAND PARIS
Post-office address Cherry Creek, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.03 c.f.s. or sufficient to water 5000 head of sheep.
Period of use, from April 1 to November 1 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation June 22, 1928

Description of Works of diversion, manner and place of use:-
Cut at spring 50 feet long, 2 feet wide and 2 feet deep covered with rock and dirt. A sump 2 feet square, 2 feet deep, rocked up, constructed at end of cut, from which water is conveyed through 10 feet of 2 inch pipe into 34 feet of semi-circular galvanized iron troughs 12 inches wide and 8 inches deep. Works located in SW 1/4 NE 1/4, Sec. 34, T. 26 N., R. 63 E., M.D.B. & M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
