CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, John B. Dangberg has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Wild Horse Springs through pipe line and troughs for stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Approximately in the SE 1/4 Section 19, T. 15 N; R. 21 E. M.D.B. & M., unsurveyed, or at a point that bears N. 38° 05' W., 17,370.00 feet from the N.E. Cor. Sec. 4, T. 14 N., R. 21 E., M.D.B. & M. situated in Ormsby County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: H. F. Dangberg Land and Livestock Company
Post-office address: Minden, Douglas County, Nevada
Amount of appropriation: 0.025 c.f.s.
Period of use, from: January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: May 28, 1917

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
The Spring has been cleaned and enlarged, and the volume of flow increased. Water is conveyed by means of conduits, flumes and pipes to 7 wooden troughs, each 16 feet long. Works located approximately in the same sub-division as the point of diversion.

Note: 8000 sheep, 500 cattle and 100 horses are watered at Wild Horse Springs.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.


