CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Alan F. Walter, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for quasi-municipal and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 31, T.20S., R.61E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NE corner of said Section 31 bears N. 85° 43' 37" E., a distance of 1279.29 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Las Vegas Valley Water District, a Q-M Corp.
Post-office address: Las Vegas, Nevada
Amount of appropriation: 0.25 c.f.s., but not to exceed 4.3 million gallons annually
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year
* Date of priority of appropriation: February 4, 1955

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed in the well, thence conveyed to storage tanks, thence via a distribution system where it is used for quasi-municipal purposes within the service area of the Las Vegas Artesian Basin.

*This certificate changes the point of diversion, manner of use and place of use of Permit 16039, Certificate 4953, therefore the date of priority remains the same as Permit 16039, Certificate 4953.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
