CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Elgie Thompson, Permittee has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source (Well No. 2) through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for quasi-municipal purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 35, T.2N., R.69E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW Corner of said Section 35 bears S. 45° 19' 50" W., a distance of 4274.78 feet situated in Lincoln County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Post-office address Pioche, Nevada

* Amount of appropriation 0.100 c.f.s., but not to exceed 0.396 million gallons annually

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation September 16, 1974

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is developed in the well, thence conveyed via a distribution system which consists of an 850 gallon pressure storage tank, 2 HP pump. Water is used within a trailer park bar and home within a portion of the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 35, T.2N., R.69E., M.D.B.&M.

*The total combined duty of water granted under this certificate and any certificate issued under Permit 28691 shall not exceed 1.144 million gallons annually.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
