CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Richard W. Forman, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for industrial and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 23, T.9N., R.56E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 25, T.9N., R.56E., M.D.B.&M., bears S. 50° 38' 14" E., a distance of 10307.47 feet situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Northwest Exploration Co.
Post-office address Farmington, New Mexico
Amount of appropriation 0.10 c.f.s., but not to exceed 5.256 million gallons annually
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation March 16, 1977

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed in the well, thence conveyed via a distribution system where it is used in conjunction with the drilling and production of oil wells within the place of use as described in the application. The use is industrial and domestic.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and corrects a typographical error made on the duty of water under the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
