CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, William A. Nisbet, Agent has presented to the State Engineer

of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an Underground Source (East Spruce Well)

through a drilled well, pump and stockwater troughs for Stockwater and Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 17, T.32N., R.64E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 36, T.32N., R.64E., M.D.B.&M., bears S. 54° 01' E., a distance of 31,568.0 feet

situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Loyd Sorensen

Post-office address: Elko, Nevada

Amount of appropriation: 0.03 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 600 head of cattle and 3,000 sheep

Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: June 29, 1981

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is diverted from a drilled well, 200 feet deep, 6" diameter casing, equipped with a gasoline engine driven Jensen Jack pump, thence the water is conveyed via a 4" pipeline to a 4,000 gallon storage tank and a 100' long stockwater trough where 600 head of cattle and 3,000 sheep water within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 17, T.32N., R.64E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
