CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, J. Allen Bell, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Indian Spring North through a spring, natural pool and channel and rectangular weir for Fish and Wildlife Propagation and Recreation purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 35, T.17S., R.50E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 35 bears S. 72° 10' E., a distance of 2,465.9 feet situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: State of Nevada - Department of Wildlife
Post-office address: Reno, Nevada
Amount of appropriation: 0.118 c.f.s., but not to exceed 27.84 million gallons annually
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: January 29, 1980

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water from Indian Spring North is retained in its natural pool and channel as a natural habitat for the Nevada pupfish, fish and wildlife propagation, public recreation, education and scientific research purposes. The place of use is located within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 35, T.17S., R.50E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
