CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Norman E. Gubler, Permittee has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an Underground Source (Rock Canyon Well) through a drilled well, pump and stockwatering trough for Livestock and Wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 33, T.5S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 33 bears S. 61° 28' E., a distance of 4,820.0 feet situated in Lincoln County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Gubler Trust #507 (78%); J and P Cattle Co. (18%)
Fenton Bowler (49%)

Post-office address: Santa Clara, Utah

Amount of appropriation: 0.0159 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 500 head of cattle and 10 horses

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: October 29, 1981

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is diverted from a drilled well, 200 feet deep, 6 inch diameter casing, equipped with a Jensen jack gasoline driven pump, thence the water is conveyed to a 54' diameter, 35,000 gallon stockwater storage tank where 500 head of cattle and 10 horses water within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 33, T.5S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
