CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Harold P. Depaoli, Permittee has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an Underground Source

through a drilled well, pump and stockwatering troughs for Stockwater and Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NE 1/4 (Lot 2) Section 4, T.20N., R.23E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 33, T.21N., R.23E., M.D.B.&M., bears N. 68° 01' 24" E., a distance of 2,253.92 feet situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 0.01 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 320 head of cattle
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation October 25, 1983

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is diverted from a drilled well, 407 feet deep, 6 inch diameter casing, equipped with a Meyer's pump jack and a 7 H.P. Briggs & Stratton motor, thence the water is conveyed by 20' of 1" pipeline to 750 gallon stockwatering tank where 320 head of cattle water within Lot 2 (NW 1/4 NE 1/4) of Section 4, T.20N., R.23E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
