CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Alan S. Boyack, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an Underground Source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for Irrigation and Domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 23, T.47N., R.64E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N 1/4 corner of said Section 23 bears N. 50° 57' 32" W., a distance of 677.88 feet situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
* Date of priority of appropriation August 12, 1977

Description of land to which the water is appurtenant:
17.62 Acres in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 23, T.47N., R.64E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the Salmon River Settlement Agreement dated May 20, 1952.

*This certificate changes the point of diversion of Permit 33140, therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Permit 33140.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre per annum from any and/or all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
