CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, William A. Nisbet, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an Underground Source

through a drilled well, pump and stockwatering troughs for Stockwater and Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 24, T.41N., R.66E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 36, T.41N., R.66E., M.D.B.&M., bears S. 13° 55' E., a distance of 13,534.0 feet

situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Lands of Sierra, Inc.

Post-office address Reno, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.009 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 30 head of cattle

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation February 19, 1985

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is diverted from a drilled well, 8 inch diameter casing, equipped with a 3-1/2" drawpipe and Aermotor windmill, thence the water is conveyed 12' by 2" pipeline to a 7' circular trough plus two 6' circular troughs which overflows in a retention pond 75' x 100' x 6' deep where 300 head of cattle water within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 and NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 24, T.41N., R.66E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
