CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

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WHEREAS, Duane V. Merrill, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a submersible pump, meter, storage tanks and distribution system for Commercial and Domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 25, T.38N., R.54E., M.D.B.&M. or at a point from which the N 1/4 corner of said Section 25 bears N. 0° 46' 15" E., 2230.20 feet distant situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Manner of Use:	Commercial and Domestic
Amount of appropriation:	0.082 c.f.s. but not to exceed 0.55 million gallons annually
Period of use:	January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation:	January 7, 1982

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is developed from a drilled well 154 feet in depth with 8 5/8 inch casing, equipped with a submersible pump, motor and totalizing meter. Water is delivered via a distribution system with storage tanks to a bar and cafe, two mobile homes and eleven RV spaces where water is utilized for commercial, domestic and fire protection purposes within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4, SW 1/4 NE 1/4 and NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 25, T.38N., R.54E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
